GMC REGIONAL REVIEW 2015

Whilst we spend a large part of our time organising and arranging school visits to Employer and Education Providers, it is now our turn to receive a visit from our regulatory organisation, the GMC. As part of the process to assure the HEEoE Quality Monitoring Systems the GMC have already visited seven trusts in the region, namely Bedford Hospital, Cambridge University Hospital, East & North Herts, Ipswich, Norfolk & Norwich, Norfolk & Suffolk and Queen Elizabeth King's Lynn. They have also visited our two Medical Schools, Norwich and Cambridge. The feedback from the visits has been positive and we now hope this continues when the GMC come to visit us on 2nd and 3rd December. We have invited many representatives from across the region, including Foundation and Specialty Training Programme Directors, DMEs, Heads of School, Patient and Public Voice Partners and a large number of trainee doctors, all of whom will have an opportunity to contribute to our Review. We look forward to receiving our feedback from the GMC so that we can continue to ensure that our trainees receive great training and provide good patient care and experience.

Pharmacy Pre-registration Programmes at UEA

As from this year East of England has both pharmacy pre-registration programmes commissioned via the UEA contract, this has provided the opportunity to fully integrate the education and training for the pharmacy workforce into mainstream commissioning. For the first time it will be possible to collect quality data relating to the Pharmacy workforce through our Quality Improvement and Performance Framework.

The UEA School of Pharmacy team in partnership with the pharmacy tutors and pharmacy assessors from the Trusts have been successful in planning and delivering the education and training packages for the new programmes.

The 15/16 cohorts studying on Pre-Registration Trainee Pharmacist programme and Pre-registration Trainee Pharmacy Technician programme have now undertaken their first respective residential blocks. The blended delivery model gives the opportunity for the trainees to receive face to face teaching for the more complex academic components of their programme with the added bonus of meeting and networking other trainees from across East of England. Evaluation from trainees and employer feedback have been discussed at the first course management meeting held in November aimed at building on good practice and to develop both programmes to meet the current and future needs of the pharmacy workforce.

QIPF EDUCATION PROVIDERS' HANDBOOK

The QIPF Education Provider handbook is now available. Universities and Employers have been sent a hard copy and additional copies can be downloaded from: https://heeo.e.hee.nhs.uk/sites/default/files/docustore/qipf_handbook_15_16.pdf

The main changes in 2015/16 include: exemplar and key evidence for each KPI to ensure it is more explicitly documented, the strengthening of the Employability KPI, the revision of the threshold for the attrition KPIs to drive further reduction in attrition and the introduction of a Quantitative KPI to measure the percentage of students who have graduated and their first destination is known. The process has introduced a KPI which focuses on the Improvement Plan following the annual review meetings in 2014/15 and measures its production, governance and achievement. HEE is also developing the relationship between Education Provider and Employer QIPF with a KPI in the Employer QIPF measuring Employers' contribution to the Education Provider QIPF.

The 2015/16 Student survey is now open

The 2015/16 Student Survey is now open. This is a survey which Universities send to all pre-registration students (Nurses, Midwives, Health Visitors, Allied

Health Professionals, Clinical Psychologists and Pharmacy students). There are 2 surveys this year: one for first year students and one for continuing students. Initial response rates are higher than last year and feedback from the pilots that HEE ran were positive. Initial results will be available on 14th December 2015.

Annual Review Meetings — Education Providers

The Annual Review Meetings for Education Providers are booked for 2016. The ARMs will include both a student focus group and a service user focus group.

Library & Knowledge Services: improving quality through new ways of working

'[Knowledge for Healthcare](#)' is [Health Education England's](#) development framework for Library & Knowledge Services (LKS) to be delivered 2015-2020. Healthcare library and knowledge services are a powerhouse for education, lifelong learning, research and evidence-based practice. Our ambition is to extend this role so that healthcare knowledge services become business-critical instruments of informed decision making and innovation. Our vision:- NHS bodies, their staff, learners, patients and the public use the right knowledge and evidence, at the right time, in the right place, enabling high quality decision-making, learning, research and innovation to achieve excellent healthcare and health improvement.

As part of achieving the vision for LKS we are looking at piloting a merged service across three Trusts in Essex. Data collated from the pilot will enable us to inform a business case to provide LKS across Essex WP with a new model of working providing efficiencies and improving quality through streamlining back office functions, upskilling staff and investing in new roles like the well-established Clinical Librarian Service at BTUH. One of the metrics for delivery of Knowledge for Healthcare is to increase the number of Clinical Librarians from 58% to 80%. We are also investing in one Library Management System to provide easy access to resources and updating and refreshing the regional LKS website www.eel.nhs.uk to work towards an ideal of one LKS for all our staff across the East of England.
