What is prescribing?

- 'Prescribing' is used to describe many related activities, including supply of prescription only medicines, prescribing medicines, devices and dressings on the NHS and advising patients on the purchase of over the counter medicines and other remedies.
- It may also be used to describe written information provided for patients (information prescriptions) or advice given.

Prescription writing

• In its guidelines on responsibility for prescribing (circular EL (91) 127) between hospitals and general practitioners, the Department of Health has advised that legal responsibility for prescribing lies with the doctor who signs the prescription.



Adverse reactions

- Vigilance
- Yellow card
- Side-effects
- MHRA drug safety update

Prescribing in co-morbidity

- Hepatic impairment
- Renal impairment
- Pregnancy & breastfeeding

Prescribing in children and elderly

- Use BNFc for children
- Calculate doses when necessary
- Discuss unlicensed use
- Report adverse drug reactions in children
- Offer option of administration
- Medication review regularing in elderly

Prescribing in palliative care

- Pain and symptom control
- Terminal care
- Specialist involvement
- Refer to Local guidance
- Minimise number of medication

Prescribing antibiotics

- Consider necessity
- Choose appropriately
- Avoid broad-spectrum
- Use local guidelines
- Explain benefits vs risks
- Consider options: patient education; delayed scripts


Remote prescribing

- Only when necessary
- Satisfy yourself about appropriate assessment
- Applies to both UK and overseas prescriptions

Sports medicine

 You must not prescribe or collude in the provision of medicines or treatment with the intention of improperly enhancing an individual's performance in sport.
