Note 1 - Satisfactory completion is defined in Regulation 9(1). It means, in relation to a period of training in any employment, the completion of that period of training in such a manner as to have acquired the medical experience which may reasonably be expected to be acquired from training of that duration in that employment.

Note 2 - Part time training is defined in Regulation 7 as follows:-

(a) in computing any period of training which began on or before 31st December 1994 there shall be disregarded any period of part-time employment during which the duties of the person employed occupied less than half of the time usually occupied by the duties of persons employed whole-time in similar employment; and

(b) in computing any period of training which began after 31st December 1994 there shall be disregarded any period of part time employment during which the duties of the person employed, taken week by week, occupied less than 60% of the time usually occupied by the duties of persons employed whole-time in similar employment.

and in relation to any period of training which began after 31st December 1994 employment which is not whole time shall not be regarded as equivalent to whole time employment unless it includes at least two periods of whole time employment each lasting not less than one week, one such period falling within paragraph (3) [training as a GP registrar] and one within paragraph 4 [training in hospital posts].

Note 3 - attestation to completion of summative assessment Some trainees split the period of training as a GP registrar into one or more terms The section of the form attesting to the passing of summative assessment need only be completed at the stage when the GP registrar has passed all elements of summative assessment.

Note 4 - Approval of trainers The approval of trainers is defined in regulation 7:-

7(1) A practitioner [is approved if] -

(a) his name is included in a medical list; and

(b) he is for the time being approved by the Joint Committee

(2) An approval under paragraph (1) may be withdrawn by the Joint Committee at any time before it expires

(3) The Joint Committee must, before approving a practitioner..... be satisfied that the characteristics and qualities of the practitioner and his practice are such that he is suitable to provide the experience referred to in regulation 6(3)

Note 3 - Approval of training posts The approval of hospital posts is defined in regulation 8(2):-

The Joint Committee may approve a post for the purposes of paragraph (1) if-

(a) it is approved by the Specialist Training Authority of the Medical Royal Colleges pursuant to Article 7 of the European Specialist Medical Qualifications Order 1995(b); or

(b) it is not so approved and the post is one for which there is no relevant Royal College or Faculty
