<p>Role purpose and context</p>	<p>The East of England Office within Health Education England (HEE) and [Insert Trust] are committed to providing outstanding support and development for Doctors in Training.</p> <p>To facilitate this, we plan to appoint a number of either education, leadership or global health fellows based in [Insert specialty] in [insert Trust] to improve the quality of medical education across the whole of the East of England.</p> <p>Clinical Component (to be completed by Trust)</p> <p>Simulation/ Education: The use of simulation as a technique to improve healthcare training is widespread in East of England. You will be part of our simulation team tasked with developing and embedding simulation. You would be expected to join the simulation steering committee and to promote the delivery of the regional simulation strategy.</p> <p>You will be supported to undergo formal training in the delivery and construction of simulation activities. You will have the opportunity to work with our foundation team, including utilising simulation-based education, to test and refine different delivery methods for the generic programme at your local trust and other test sites for evaluation. You will also be part of the evaluation and delivery of regional teaching.</p> <p>Dependent on previous experience and specialty interest, you will have the opportunity to engage in educational research either around the evaluation of taught programmes, or in the consideration of educational theories and how they relate to simulation in healthcare. It would be expected that the research would be submitted for presentation at a regional or national simulation conference.</p> <p>Quality Improvement/ Leadership: [Completed by Trust Lead]</p> <p>Global Health: There is an option for fellows to attend and complete the Diploma of sexual</p>
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	<p>and reproductive health (DSRH) in the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (Jan- March 2019) followed by an attachment overseas sponsored by Cambridge Global Health (formerly Addenbrookes Abroad). Alternatively trainees may choose to spend time in the UK working on a global health project or completing an on line diploma in tropical medicine with subsequent visit overseas.</p> <p>The appointees will have the opportunity to engage in relevant research and will be expected to publish and / or present your work at Regional and National Meetings</p>
