Nick works as a general dental practitioner in Woodbridge and was previously a FD trainer for 3 years in Norwich. He also works for HEE EoE and is actively involved in the selection process of FD trainers, and is an assessor for FD equivalence training applications. Nick is a Dental Professional Adviser to the East Anglian Area team of NHS England and is the national secretary of the national Association of Dental Advisers and recently has been appointed as a Panel member for NICE.
