Completion of this is an essential part of fulfilling very many of the competencies within the Professional, Management and Leadership Domains that are required for satisfactory completion of Dental Foundation Training. The project includes a checklist to cross reference the areas you cover in your work with the competencies from the DFT curriculum. This will be recorded in your E-Portfolio.

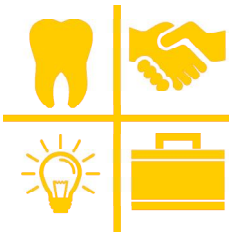

During his MSc, his research project focused on the management of patients with persistent dentoalveolar pain, and is currently working on publishing his research in scientific journals.

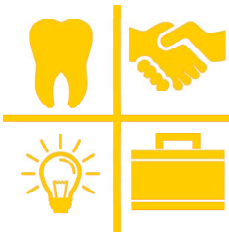

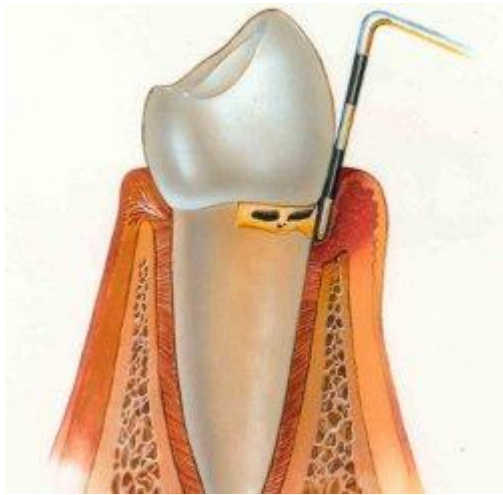

Imran is a Specialist Periodontist at Norfolk Dental Specialists. His professional exposure to a number of different areas within dentistry has provided him the necessary skills in the following areas: periodontal treatment, dental implants, oral surgery and conscious sedation.

This session with the specialist periodontist, will help to highlight the most effective treatment planning and managements strategies for our patients with a periodontal problem. Imran will seek to identify risk factors and signs that can assist with correct assessment of vulnerable patients and discuss the most up to date strategies of practical management. He will also explore some of the com-mon pitfalls that unwary GDP's can encounter when deal-ng with chronic periodontal disease in all its various forms.

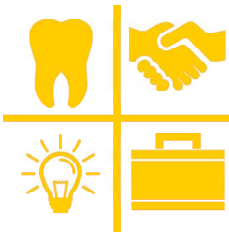

An introduction into team working in the dental environment. How to communicate with different team members effectively and how to get the most out of them. Working effectively in the Practice depends upon teamwork. From studying the England national sports teams it is obvious that: most teams need to be well selected; most teams need to train together to be successful; most teams need to achieve success; most teams need to improve. Is the dental team any different?

Today we shall be bringing our Dental Nurses to the Day Release Course and we shall be working together to try to build up a pattern of good teamwork. We shall be trying to understand how people work together in teams and what makes us act in certain ways. This will give us help in understanding difficulties in the team building process. We shall also look at how an effective team can work to provide improved patient care not only in the surgery but also throughout the whole practice. We shall also have a chance to discuss difficulties experienced by ourselves in the process of team-working and learn how to overcome some of these difficulties.

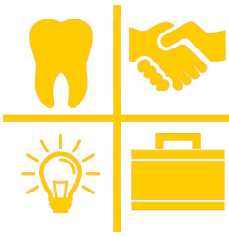

This process was developed to get early identification of trainees with additional educational needs and or requiring additional pastoral support.

At week 6, Educational Supervisors (ES), Foundation Dentists (FDs) and Training Programme Directors (TPDs) are asked to complete a report in the E-Portfolio. These also include sections on areas of notable practice and areas of issues and concerns.

The ES will provide feedback on your performance in the DOPs completed in the first few weeks and of your progress and identified learning needs so far.

At the ERS, we will look at how you are settling into the practice, and review your report and that of your ES, and look at significant events and sick days.

Please bring with you your work on Foundation Skills so far. You can also use this opportunity to give feedback on the programme so far this year.

The TPD completes their report independently. Again this reviews the same curriculum domains by reviewing the E-Portfolio and their own observation from study days. They highlight both areas of notable practice and areas of concern.

Following your interview, any action plans and outcomes will be shared with your ES.

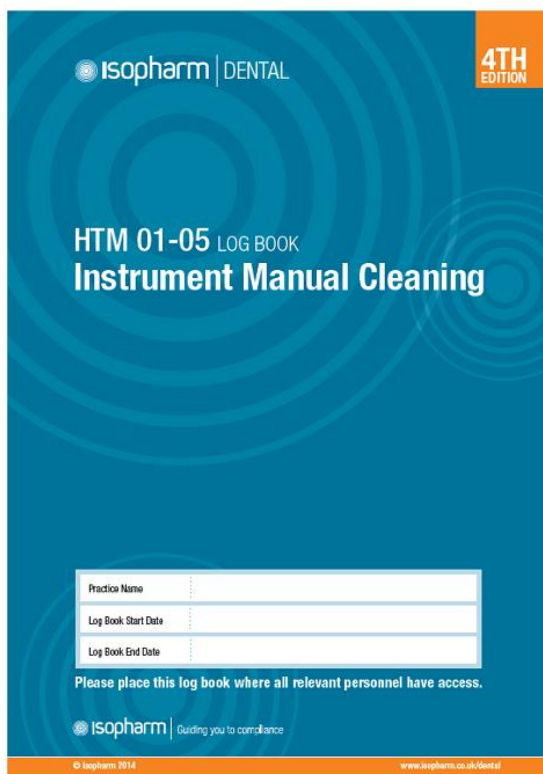

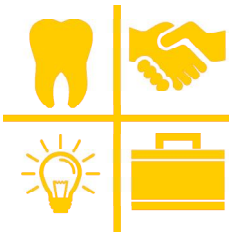

PLEASE BRING WITH YOU:

3 Extracted teeth– Molar teeth (ideally at least one upper and one lower) and take Pas of them in the mesio-distal plane and the bucco-lingual plane.

Martin qualified from Bart's and the London Dental School. After completing vocational training in Essex he worked in hospital dentistry, first as and SHO in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery and then as a Core Trainee in Restorative Dentistry. After this he returned to practice, where he completed and MSc in Endodontics. He now works primarily as an endodontist and splits his time between the Royal London and private practice in Southend and London's Harley Street. This session will include revision of basic endodontic diagnosis and treatment planning, a practical session on access cavity design and demonstration and practice of preparing teeth with the ProTaper NiTi rotary file system.

Objectives

- *Revision of basic endodontic diagnosis and treatment planning. Including aims of endodontic treatment and the steps of completing orthograde root canal treatment.*
- *Revision of access cavity design and the opportunity to practice preparing access cavities.*
- *Introduction of rotary endodontics instruments using the ProTaper rotary file system*

Learning outcomes

- *Participants should understand the goals of endodontic treatment and the stages of successful root canal treatment.*
- *Delegates should understand root canal morphology and be able to design pre-pare access cavities that allow straight-line access to all present root canals without excessive removal of tooth tissue.*
- *Participants should be able to prepare a root canal system using the ProTaper rotary file system.*

Mike Kelly is a GDP working in Edenbridge, Kent. He is well qualified to give this presentation having MGDS, MSc in crown and bridgework and a Postgraduate Teaching Certificate. He is a Training Programme Director at HEKSS West.

Successful crowns are essential in general dental practice as patients expectations are high and want crowns to last forever and look good! A reassessment of where crowns fit in modern NHS general practice. Now that they are done so much later in the restorative cycle how much does classic theory still apply.

PLEASE BRING WITH YOU:

1. Extracted unfilled or minimally filled molar or premolar teeth for the first practical.
2. Extracted heavily restored molar and premolar teeth for the 2nd practical (2 or 3). Ideally mount the teeth in a lower plastic impression tray. Do not make them touch we don't want contact points. (Mounting them in putty is OK although plaster is better, keep the CEJ clear. If mounting them in silicone putty first dry the roots and

- Practical exercises preparing intact and damaged teeth.

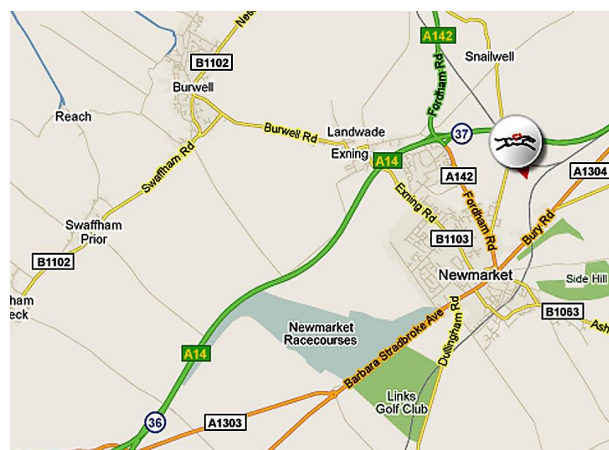
This week is a series of one day presentations by the Cascade Company. This involves all of the seven DFT Schemes in Health Education England—East of England.

The removal of certain wisdom teeth, buried roots, hemisection and certain aspects of soft tissue surgery are all part of general practice needing no referral. Recognising what you are capable of carrying out, and being confident, are a matter of experience and training.

We will be working with pigs jaws to practice the techniques of bone removal and correct use of instruments to remove teeth.

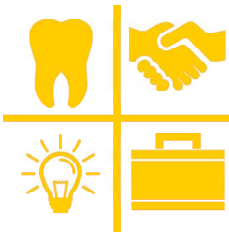
The afternoon will continue with suturing both in and around the mouth. The various types on suture material, needle sizes and types of suture will be discussed and practiced on pig's jaws.

Objectives

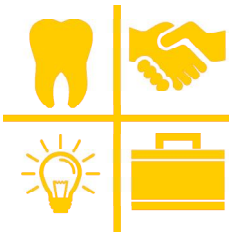

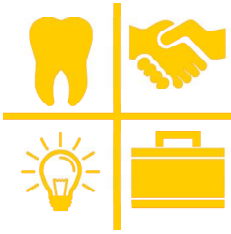
