This course is designed to summarise the current best practice advice regarding the important topics of;

- Oral Cancer
- Prescribing of antibiotics for oral conditions
- The dental emergency patient
- Anticoagulants and dental extractions

The objectives of the course are:-

1. Recognising appropriate situations for prescribing antimicrobials for dental conditions.
2. Raise awareness of oral cancer, its risk factors and treatments required.
3. Assess the emergency / urgent / routine nature of orodental problems

At the end of this course delegates will be able to:-

1. Prescribe antimicrobials for dental conditions in accordance with national guidance.
2. Recognise malignant and potentially malignant oral lesions and understand the care needs required by patients found to have mouth cancer.
3. Justify any intervention offered, evaluate where intervention is outside your remit, and formulate appropriate plans for onward referral, self-management and locating the appropriate dental service.
