PH Workforce Development - Policy Drivers

- Healthy lives, healthy people: Improving outcomes and supporting transparency, DH, 2011
- Public health workforce strategy published jointly in 2013 by the DH, PHE & the LGA & updated in 2014
- The Five Year Forward review by NHS England and partner organisations in 2014 - Focus on recognising the role and contribution of the wider PH workforce to health and wellbeing



PHE EoE: Ambition

- To develop EoE Centre as a Centre of Excellence for learning, development and training across all specialist, generalist and functional areas, and all staff groups
- Will encompass speciality training, practitioners, placements, the wider workforce, PHE Centre staff and also cross-organisational and system – wide approaches

- PHE's commitment to providing a conducive environment for learning and supporting staff in seeking new opportunities to develop personally and professionally

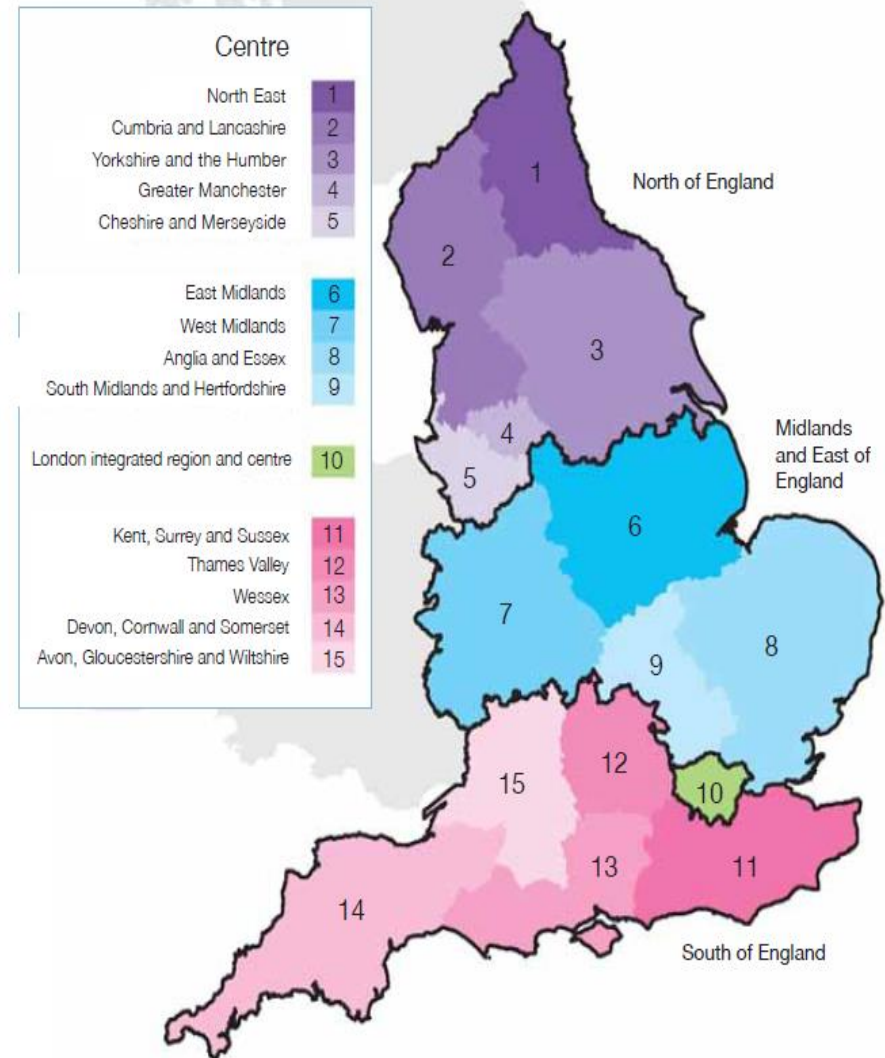


PHE local presence
