Process for allocation to Foundation Programmes commencing August 2017:

- East Anglian Foundation School
- Essex, Bedfordshire & Hertfordshire Foundation School

On **9 March 2017** your allocation to Foundation School will be available through your online account with UKFPO/Oriel.

The next step in the recruitment process is the allocation to Foundation Programmes which will be undertaken locally by the Foundation Schools.

If you have been allocated to the East Anglian Foundation School (EAFS) OR the Essex, Bedfordshire & Hertfordshire Foundation School (EBH) please note the process below.

Allocation to EAFS/EBH Programmes

- Following notification of your allocation to the EAFS or EBH, the programme preferences screen in the national Foundation Programme application system
 (Oriel) will be made available to you to select your preferences.
- You will be asked to rank the Foundation Programmes available in the EAFS or EBH in your order of preference.
- You must rank a minimum of 100 programmes. Dependent on the number of programmes that you rank, there is no absolute guarantee that you will be offered one of your preferred programmes.

- If you have been recognised as having special circumstances, we will contact you individually with advice regarding the selection of preferences for your particular situation.
- If you have been allocated to EAFS or EBH as a linked application please note
 we will not be linking to specific Foundation Programmes. This means that you
 are likely to be placed in different hospitals across the school.
- Each Programme is identified by an individual Programme Code. For a group of three programmes with the same rotating posts, each programme retains a unique programme code. If you want to have the maximum opportunity to obtain one of your preferred rotations you will need to select all three programme codes. However, you are not obliged to select all three options for one rotation. We advise you to carefully consider your choice and order of programmes in the context of your score, and in the knowledge that the national score range will be between 34 and 100. We will provide graphic representation of the range of scores for those allocated to the EAFS and EBH. Please note that a number of programmes across EAFS and EBH do NOT rotate in sets of three (a triplex) and so be mindful of this when selecting these jobs.
- The allocation process will be undertaken using an algorithm that matches the highest score first to the highest available preference, and cascaded down in score order.

- The timeline for this process can be found on our Foundation School website,

 Health Education East of England and you will be notified of your match to a specific programme on the 6 April

 2017. Please ensure that you have completed your programme selections no later than 12.00 midday on 01 April 2017. You are under an obligation to accept a programme that is offered to you through this process, and we request that you verify your acceptance within seventy two hours (3 working days) of being informed of the outcome.
- The Foundation School will make a recommendation of the allocated applicants to the employing Trusts. The offer of employment will be made by an individual Trust. Any offer of employment will be conditional on receipt of satisfactory references, occupational health clearance and CRB disclosure. Where an individual Trust is proposing to undertake further pre employment checks the offer of employment will be made on a provisional basis. These checks may include an interview or an assessment process

Preparation for professional practice

All new F1 trainees allocated to the East Anglian Foundation School and the Essex, Bedfordshire & Hertfordshire Foundation School will be required to undertake a mandatory Preparation for Professional Practice Week (PfPP). This will be held one week prior to commencing F1. It is compulsory to attend, leave will only be granted under the most exceptional of circumstances and therefore this is paid.

Please be aware of this when making your plans for the summer so that you return in time to commence work.



Programme Allocation

- F1 and F2 are linked together for all EAFS/EBH Foundation Programmes. You will be allocated to a full two year Foundation Programme.
- All programmes have approval for training from the GMC and PMETB. We are therefore not able to accommodate requests to swap placements within F1 or F2 so please do bear this in mind when making your selections.
- All standard F1 and F2 programmes are 3 x 4 month posts.
- In the spreadsheets the Foundation Programmes have been grouped into rotations. This clearly shows how you may rotate between Trusts.
- Each Programme is identified by an individual Programme Code. For a group
 of three programmes with the same rotating posts, each programme retains a
 unique programme code.
- The Programme Code for each programme is exactly the same as it will appear on the national website. You may find this useful for cross reference, as on the national website the programmes will be shown according to the Trust at which the programme starts.
- Currently the advertised programmes are <u>indicative only</u> of a generic
 Foundation Programme designed to deliver all the Foundation competencies.
 FP2017 programmes will be uploaded to Oriel and our local website as **final** before allocation to Foundation School on **6 March 2017**. All FP2017

programmes are subject to change in relation to placement order, specialty, **Health Education East of England**

length, site and Trust.

Rarely, it may also be necessary to change the placements within a rotation

due to unforeseen changes in the Foundation Programme after programme

allocation. If this should happen after the programme allocation date of April 6

2017, we shall contact those affected individually.

For placements which are off site, such as General Practice or Psychiatry

there will be a need to make your own travel arrangements and you must

consider this when selecting your programme preferences. Some of the

community placements are at a distance with poor public transport, so it is

desirable to be able to drive. Your employing Trust will issue you specific

details of the practice/site you will be working at after commencing your post.
