East of England Perioperative Medicine group oral presentation competition instructions to candidates

- 1. The above competition is conducted by the East of England Perioperative Medicine group (EoE POM G).
- 2. Junior anaesthetists, foundation doctors and medical students in the East of England are invited to participate in this competition.
- 3. The candidates should choose a title in areas such as audit, survey, research, case report or innovation in perioperative medicine.
- 4. The candidates who wish to participate must send an abstract before April 10/ 2018.
- 5. The work described in the abstract must be based on work performed primarily by the candidate and the approval of the local ethics committee should be sought as necessary.
- 6. The abstract should state the title, authors, institution, purpose or aim of the study or investigation, method, results and principal conclusions with no more than 3 references. The text and a maximum of one figure or table should be no more than 400 words.
- The submissions should be made electronically to <u>nicholas.levy@wsh.nhs.uk</u>. Six abstracts will be selected for presentation at the EoE POM G meeting and the successful authors contacted.
- 8. Each candidate will have 8 minutes for presentation and 2 minutes for discussion. During the discussion only the candidate will be expected to answer any questions from the audience.
- 9. Three judges will be nominated by the EoE POM G committee to select the best 3 presentations on the basis of: novelty, clarity, significance to clinical practice and methodology (score card available from Jane Theobald).
- 10. On the basis of the ranking prizes will be awarded by the East of England Perioperative Medicine group.
- 11. All short listed candidates will receive a certificate from the East of England Perioperative Medicine group.
