Introduction from Prof Shahid Khan, Associate Dean for SAS Doctors and LEDs

Firstly, congratulations to the winners of the Regional Innovation Awards! Dr Ewe Teh, Miss Magelia Kitcat and Dr Tamsin Holland Brown have been the winners of this year's awards. We will be inviting the winners to present their work at one of the webinars later during the year.

This is the time of the year when Regional SAS educational activities supported by HEE EoE are reviewed. The programme is shaped on feedback from SAS Tutors, comments from training events and suggestions made by colleagues in the Regional SAS Survey. Bursaries for Certificate, Diploma and top up masters in medical education have been high on the want list and hence considerable resources have been allocated to these activities. Funding for quality improvement projects and leader ship courses as well as licences for Panopto & Bridge are other key initiatives which have been introduced to support SAS colleagues. It would be fair to state that educational support for SAS doctors in the Region far exceeds that which is available to consultants and trainees in many Trusts.

Significant efforts, manpower and funding is required to plan and deliver the yearly Regional educational programme. However, despite the efforts of our Tutor Group and the HEE EoE team, there is limited engagement from SAS colleagues. There are not enough requests for bursaries or for QI projects and engagement for Regional Developmental days see dwindling numbers. This is a cause for concern as the current level of funding could not be sustained year on year if funds are under-utilised. This is an issue to discuss in local groups and has been discussed at the Regional Steering Group meetings.

On a more positive note, from 12-16 July 2021, Royal College of Physicians is celebrating SAS doctors' week. This is a good opportunity for SAS colleagues to be actively involved with RCP activities.

Quality Improvement funding

Innovation and Quality Improvement (QI) is an integral part of health care as it improves patient experience and outcomes. SAS Doctors have a key role to play in improving healthcare services. HEE will continue to support SAS Innovation, and the application window will open in due course. We are currently reviewing the timeline, and this will be communicated via email soon.

This is a unique opportunity for SAS doctors in East of England to develop projects which can embed positive and sustainable changes in their clinical practice.

In the last financial year, HEE supported a total of 13 SAS Quality Improvement Projects. Some examples of the projects supported include:

- Interventions for children with glue ear during Covid
- Database creation, Proforma and statistical analysis to support project around Carotid Endarterectomy (CEA) or Best Medial Therapy (BMT)
- Development of image processing software for optic disc photos to remotely screen for glaucoma
- To Implement the use of the PERC and PESI scores for those with possible Pulmonary Embolism
- Simulation training for Instrumental delivery
- Designing and manufacturing the prototypes for Trochanteric Bursa Garment Coccyx Pants
- Developing Clinical Leaders Programme
