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Short summary of career

I graduated from Imperial College School of Medicine with MBBS and an intercalated BSc in Medical Sciences (Anaesthetics and Surgery). Thoughts on mentoring

The natural 'organic' mentoring that was commonplace in medical practice between doctors of different experience has been squeezed out of current medical training. There are many reasons for this, not least a change in the temporal and structural continuity of clinical training, with year long or shorter rotations.

Formal mentoring that I have been involved with has usually taken the form of buddy schemes; developmental mentoring was always

opportunistic.

In my own experience, I have noted the sudden absence of the 'informal' developmental mentoring I had previously received, at the time when I would have benefited most from it. This was not for a lack of willing from those senior to me. This is why formally supported, and organised, mentoring schemes have an important niche in the NHS today, and I am delighted to be part of the EOE Programme to achieve it.
