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Introductions

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What is study leave for?

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Study leave enabling trainees to achieve their curriculum outcomes

 Consideration of discretionary study leave; career enhancing activity that adds value to the individual and/or supports the wider system

What is study leave *NOT* for ?

- Enrolment on to a training programme and payment for portfolio access
- ALS and other life support courses that are not part of the curriculum requirements
- Statutory and mandatory training required by employers
- Other employer related leave
- Bursaries for medical education courses unless they are curriculum requirements
- Fellowships (eg simulation fellowships)
- Courses for specialty examinations during Foundation year
- Professional examination fees at any point of training
- Interview leave
- Additional qualifications unless curriculum requirement



(*) Note that 17.5% of our trainees are Trust-funded ... so really £700 per trainee


From this £700 per capita...




Some figures... (2024 / 2025)

	Spend	Over / Under
ASPD (Inc Foundation)	Around £1,000,000	Underspends, around £200k
Individual requests	Around £1,900,000	Overspent, around £700k

Implications...

- We want to spend the study leave money!
- Aspirational study leave is currently overspent
- Aspirational study leave over (?) around £500 can't be spread fairly
- Note few curriculum-required courses / conferences
- Some... specialties / trainees / situations will require increased funding

Examples...

 Trainee requests a £1200 course to attend a workshop giving important skills for their future work

Examples...

 Trainee has requested several different aspirational courses across a year, each for around £300

International study leave...

- Require PGD sign off
- Either travel/accommodation or course fees whichever is least
- One per programme/one every 3 years
- Presenting a paper/poster etc as first author or only author.
- Nothing equivalent in the UK
- Cheaper than UK equivalent
- Not a holiday destination / recreational element

Foundation

Is complex – refer to:

study leave guidance for foundation programme v5 1.pdf

- FY1
 - It is not expected that there will be aspirational study leave granted in FY1
 - Study leave funding can only be claimed for travel expenses and reimbursement of ALS
- FY2
 - Foundation trainees may apply for aspirational leave time and funding during their F2 year; all must be approved by the FTPD

Other checks...

- Overnight allowance £150 (120) / night (London / elsewhere)
- Not trainees on OOP except OOPT (and not PoG)
- Not subscriptions
- Exam courses
- Large / odd items will get flagged when Trusts submit returns

Partial funding?

Expensive courses, limited money...

Appeals

Trainees can appeal if they feel a decision is unfair

- Formal process
- Trainee submits appeals form
- Assessed by three individuals (DD, AD and trainee rep not previously involved)
- Following recent appeal we seek information from the trust if appropriate

Common issues

- Unaware of process
- Late submissions
- Claims rejected centrally (eg international)

How to make it go further?

- Delivery of curricula objectives based on individual requirements is the primary consideration
- Sound educational activity is aligned to the curriculum, receives positive feedback from attendees and faculty and offers value for money
- Schools and training programmes should develop local or virtual training courses where possible to reduce the need for individuals to travel and to release resources to invest in other activities
- Data on activity should be mapped against curricula to ensure that funds are utilised correctly
- Resident doctors should consider using the most environmentally sustainable form of transport with low carbon impact when attending study leave activity

Buy local

Why is this better?

- Best aligns to trainee needs
- Easy to adapt
- More control over content and delivery
- Can offer to wider group
- Likely to be cheaper and cost effective
